From the Vicar

Thanks

November is often thought of as a month of thanksgiving. In part, this is due to the American celebration of the Thanksgiving, but the practice goes back much farther in our history. When we were a more agrarian people, our ancestors often take a day or two for a fall festival or a feast to celebrate the LORD's largess, giving thanks for the abundance that would help to see them through the worst months of winter and early spring. They understood where their daily bread came from, and they also realized how easily it could all be lost due to storms or drought, or pestilence. So they gave thanks for all that they received by giving a portion of what they produced back to the God for the care of those in need and for the ministry of the Church.

Today, with supermarkets and big box stores, when most of us have very little direct connection with the origin of our food and other goods, Thanksgiving takes on a new importance. It becomes even more crucial for us to take time out of lives to meditate over the abundance we have received from God. It also requires us to dedicate time for prayer to discern how and where our Creator wishes to give back a portion of what we have been given by God. This is the time to look around us and see what others need, and how we might best share with them. It is the time that we at St. Andrew's work together to see where the Holy Spirit is leading us. My friends, as we prepare for our own Thanksgiving feasts and celebration, let us all work as One Body in Christ to see that our neighbors are also taken care of this season, and in the seasons to come.

- ■Dec 6th is the **Christmas Fair**. The Ladies of the church have been meeting on Wed nights and making all kinds of crafts for the fair. Remember to stop by there will be lunch & goodies & gifts & handmade items..... The fair runs from 10AM to 3PM.
- ■Dec 7th is the **Tree lighting and visit from St Nicholas Party!** 5PM we will be lighting the tree in front of our church for the Christmas Season.
