Eating together as a community, and as a family, has been written about in both Testaments of the Bible. The Parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32), a feast was offered for the lost son who came home; the first miracle that Jesus did was turning water into wine which was done at a wedding feast in Cana (John 2:1-11); and the greatest feast we observe each Sunday, the Last Supper.

Feasts play an important role in our faith, our lives, and in our fellowship with each other. From the Vicar

God the Giver

"But who am I, and what is my people, that we should be able to make this freewill offering? For all things come from you, God, and of your own have we given you."
1 Chronicles 29:14

God is a giver, or more to the point, God is "the Giver". From this "fragile earth, our island home" to the technology that makes our smartphones and other devices possible, and the food we eat to ability and skills to do our work is given to us from God. Just as the passage from First Chronicles says, "all things come from you, God", absolutely all things. Ours is a God of abundance who gives from that abundance. Yes, God is the Giver, and we who are made in God's image are also called to be givers. As God's Children we are called to give back from that which we have received in order that God's Good News can be made known to all.

October is traditionally the time church communities set aside to talk about stewardship, but then the conversation often stops with the ingathering of the pledge cards. We will also begin our giving campaign this month, but it will be the beginning of a conversation, not just an event. I also invite you to share ideas and to encourage others in stewardship. Tell us what it means for you to be a giver and to allow others to share their own stories. God is "the Giver", and each of us givers, too.
